Butler Travel Scholarship Application AY Year:

Definition: International Study is an adventure that brings students face-to-face with new perspectives and cultures. As a potentially significant part of their educational experience, all University of Dubuque undergraduate students are invited to apply for a Butler Travel Scholarship to assist in funding University-approved faculty-led, short-term study abroad programs or full semester international study opportunities undertaken for an academic purpose. The scholarship can vary between \$200-\$2000 depending upon a number of considerations, including financial need, cost of program and other factors. Priority will be given to students with no international experience and to those who have never received the Butler Travel Scholarship in previous years. These funds may be used for transportation, food, housing and miscellaneous costs (i.e., concert/museum tickets) associated with an approved study program.

Purpose: The purpose of Butler Travel Scholarships is to enable students of demonstrated need to undertake a rigorous and robust study/travel abroad experience. To be considered for the scholarship, students will be evaluated in a holistic way with an emphasis on good character reflecting the Mission and Values of the University, financial need, academic promise, and who, in the estimation of the Butler Travel Scholarship Committee, will most benefit from a travel abroad experience. In other words, the scholarship program is intended to reduce the financial barrier so that high-achieving students of limited financial means may participate in an international experience as part of their college education.

Eligibility: All aspects must be satisfied:

- The student must be an undergraduate or graduate student at the University of Dubuque
- The student must be in good academic standing at the time of the application (not probation or suspension);
- The student must be identified by the UD Financial Aid Office as needing aid.
