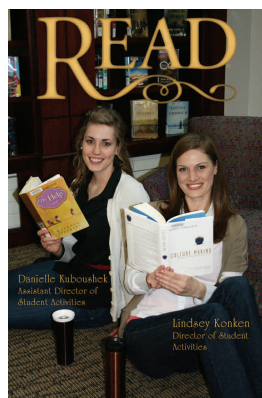
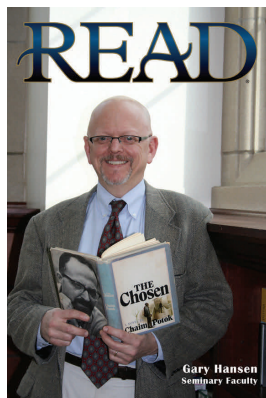
Becky Canovan, Diana Newman and public relations intern Erin Crane, created the eight posters.
