

SEMINARY SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS POLICY FOR FEDERAL AND INSTITUTIONAL FINANCIAL AID:

Satisfactory Academic Progress

Students must maintain at least a 3.0 grade point average and earn at least the required minimum credit hours per semester to remain in —good standing. The college reserves the right at any time to suspend any student who is not making satisfactory academic progress toward a degree.

Probation, Suspension and Dismissal

A student whose cumulative grade-point average falls below 2.0 or who receives a grade of F or No Credit for six or more semester hours in a given semester shall be placed on academic probation. Students on academic probation do not have the option of choosing credit/no credit grading and are not eligible for financial aid.

Part-time students will have their quantitative progress measure prorated.

Students who have attended colleges or universities that are not regionally accredited, or who have marginal academic record, may be admitted on academic probation. Students who are on academic probation for two successive semesters may be dismissed from the seminary.

In situations in which a student's poor academic performance is the result of unforeseen personal circumstances, the student may make written application to the Financial Aid Sub-Committee of the Academic and Student Affairs Committee of the faculty to have financial aid eligibility reinstated for the following semester. Such application must ordinarily be made before the first day of the following semester.
