



Cassat Hall was built in 1968 and named for David B. Cassat, Board Member (1936-1982) and Chair (1965-1967). The building was financed partly through government funds and partly through the Cassat family. His son George continues to serve on the UD Board.

Donnell Hall was built in 1967. Donnell Hall was named for A. Douglas Donnell, Board Member (1940-1978) and Chair (1949-1964). Douglas Donnell and David Cassat were longtime close friends. So the proximity of the buildings is appropriate.

Both halls are co-ed, with alternating floors for men and women, and are located at the midpoint between North and South Campuses. The interior of both residence halls underwent major renovation in the summer of 2004. In addition to the renovation, new furniture has been placed throughout the residence halls.

TYPICAL ROOM LAYOUT

- 1 - Desks: Slide-out shelf for keyboard and 3 drawers on right side.
[Dimensions L48" x W24" x H30"]
- 2 - Microfridge unit: Includes refrigerator, freezer, and microwave.
[Dimensions L18.5" x W19.25" x H45"]
- 3 - Beds: Extra-long twin beds. [Dimensions L79" x W38"]
- 4 - Dressers: Each dresser has 3 drawers. [Dimensions L24.5" x W24" x H24.5"]
- 5 - Wardrobes: Each with doors, top shelf and hanging rod.
[Dimensions L35" x W24" x H73"]
- 6 - Windows: Two windows with adjustable blinds. [Dimensions L24" x W63"]

Each room is equipped with basic cable, WiFi, two network ports (providing internet access), and 4 electrical outlets on each side of the room.

Furniture may be rearranged, and beds may be lofted (with approved lofts) or bunked for more room. Rooms are not air-conditioned.
