While there were many uncertainties that we faced across campus during the 2020-2021 academic year, UD remained committed to the health and safety of our entire campus community.

By working together, we were able to live and learn through the implementation of the following protocols:

- We were committed to practicing UD's Mantra: *Practice common sense – good hygiene, social distancing, and wear a face covering for yourself and for others.*
- Capacity levels of learning and social spaces on campus and at LIFE sites were updated to accommodate social distancing.
- Classroom instruction was delivered in-person/synchronous and remote/synchronous depending on a students' particular situation.
- Increased cleaning procedures were implemented.
- Signs were placed around campus to remind the UD community that everyone has a part in helping to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.
- Students completed the COVID-19 Health Assessment survey before each semester.
- We performed over 5,000 COVID-19 tests on campus to ensure that our protocols were effective.
