### Suggestions:

- \*It is recommended that you take ENG 101, COM 101, & ENG 104 within your first 4 semesters
- \*THEA 220 to meet Fine & Performing Arts Gen. Ed.
- \*PRF 200 to meet Personal/Fin. Stewardship Gen. Ed.
- \*HIST 211 / 212 to meet Hist./Phil./Politics Gen. Ed. and Education requirement

Admission to the program occurs during the same semester that EDU 200 is taken.

### Admission Criteria

1. Completion of a C or better in ENG 101, ENG 104, MATH 112 (or higher), COM 101, EDU 100, EDU 200, EDU 202
2. GPA 2.75 or higher
3. Admissions Essay
4. Application
5. All grades must be C or better and students can only retake a class one time
6. Completion of 10 service learning hours in EDU 100
7. Completion of 20 school-based hours in EDU 200
8. Completion of Admission Interview
