

INTERPROFESSIONAL SIMULATION

Interprofessional simulation is a learning approach that involves multiple disciplines working together to simulate real-world scenarios.

On September 13, 2025, the UD Nursing and Physician Assistant students partnered for a collaborative training session focused on sepsis.

In simulated scenarios, they practiced patient care, communication, and teamwork. This hands-on approach helped students:

- Recognize early signs and symptoms of sepsis to ensure timely intervention.
- Apply effective treatment protocols while prioritizing patient safety.
- Strengthen interdisciplinary collaboration through clear communication and coordinated care.
