

About the Lead Instructor

The Rev. Timothy Matthew Slemmons, Ph.D., is a Presbyterian *Minister of the Word and Sacrament*, and *Professor of Homiletics and Worship* at UDTS, where he has taught since 2008 and directed the Doctor of Ministry program from 2017 to 2025. He holds degrees from Kansas State University, Columbia Theological Seminary, and Princeton Theological Seminary, where his dissertation focused on Kierkegaard's view and practice of preaching. A past recipient of the David H. C. Read Preacher/Scholar Award, a proponent of lectionary

expansion and arguably the leading translator of Johannes Oecolampadius, his numerous books include Groans of the Spirit: Homiletical Dialects in an Age of Confusion; Year D: A Quadrennial Supplement to the Revised Common Lectionary; The Good Confession, and (as translator) Works of Oecolampadius (B&N Press).
